

This letter has been sent to you because you have been identified as a potential stakeholder, by virtue of being an affected landowner, Northern is committed to keeping stakeholders apprised of upcoming project status.

Northern Natural Gas is an interstate natural gas pipeline that provides natural gas transportation and natural gas storage services in the Midwest. The pipeline facilities extend from Texas to the Upper Peninsula of Michigan. Headquartered in Omaha, Nebraska, Northern has been in the natural gas transportation business since 1930.

Northern Natural Gas Company (Northern) filed an application with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) requesting authorization to abandon in-place approximately 29.63 miles of its 16-inch-diameter A-line located in Boone, Dallas and Polk, counties, Iowa, and replace the lost capacity of 340 million cubic feet per day with the installation of an approximately 9.07-mile-long 20-inch-diameter extension of its C-line; the extension will be installed in two noncontiguous segments. A 4.96-mile-long North C-line Extension will be installed in Boone and Dallas, counties, Iowa, and a 4.11-mile-long South C-line Extension will be installed in Polk County, Iowa. Following FERC approval of Northern's application and the subsequent abandonment of the A-line, and the construction and in-service of the C-line extension, the abandoned A-line will be sold to a third-party salvage company.

A separate notice regarding Northern's application will be mailed to affected landowners and other stakeholders involved with the project. You may contact Northern regarding questions about the proposed project by calling a toll-free number (888-367-6671).

Dear Sir or Madam:

Northern Natural Gas Company (Northern) owns, and operates an interstate natural gas pipeline system and is regulated by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC). On December 3, 2021, Northern filed an application with FERC in Docket No. CP22-26-000 requesting authorization to abandon in-place approximately 29.63 miles of its 16-inch-diameter A-line located in Boone, Dallas and Polk, counties, Iowa, and replace the lost capacity of 340 million cubic feet per day with the installation of an approximately 9.07-mile-long 20-inch-diameter extension of its C-line; the extension will be installed in two noncontiguous segments. A 4.96-mile-long North C-line Extension will be installed in Boone and Dallas, counties, Iowa, and a 4.11-mile-long South C-line Extension will be installed in Polk County, Iowa. Following FERC approval of Northern's application and the subsequent abandonment of the A-line and the construction and in-service of the C-line extension, the abandoned A-line will be sold to a third-party salvage company.

Northern must obtain FERC approval to abandon, construct and operate the proposed facilities. Northern requested that FERC issue an order approving the proposed project by January 19, 2023. Northern anticipates construction to commence spring 2023, with all facilities abandoned, constructed, and in-service by November 1, 2023.

Northern will utilize a 100-foot-wide temporary work space (TWS) to accommodate installation of the pipelines and disconnect the A-line from Northern's system; the TWS will be reduced to 75 feet wide at one area to avoid a wetland. Various sizes of extra temporary work space (ETWS), staging areas and new or to be improved temporary access roads also will be utilized for the proposed project. Northern will utilize existing easements where practicable; Northern will work with landowners to obtain permanent pipeline and facility easements and temporary work space.

This letter has been sent to you because you have been identified as a potential stakeholder, by virtue of being an affected landowner, a public official in the project area, or a representative of a permitting or interested agency. You may have been previously notified by Northern regarding surveys, permits and/or clearances for the project.

The fourth item is the Summary of Landowner Rights Under Iowa "Eminent Domain" Statutes.







Take notice that on December 3, 2021, Northern Natural Gas Company (Northern), 1111 South 103rd Street, Omaha, NE 68124, filed an application under sections 7(c) and 7(b) of the Natural Gas Act (NGA), and Part 157 of the Commission's regulations requesting authorization to: (1) abandon in-place and by removal the A-line and associated branch line, tie-over piping and aboveground facilities; and (2) install and operate the replacement North C-line Extension and South Cline Extension and associated branch line, tie-over piping and aboveground facilities, all with appurtenances and all located in Boone, Dallas and Polk counties in Iowa. Specifically, Northern proposes to abandon approximately 29.63 miles of its 16-inch-diameter Des Moines IAB65001 A-line (A-line) and appurtenances in Boone, Dallas and Polk counties, Iowa. Northern also requests authorization to construct and operate an approximately 9.07-mile extension of its 20-inch-diameter Des Moines IAB65003 C-line (C-line) and appurtenances in Boone, Dallas and Polk counties, Iowa, to replace the capacity associated with the abandoned A-line. Northern estimates the cost of the project to be \$36,981,705, all as more fully set forth in the application which is on file with the Commission and open for public inspection.

In addition to publishing the full text of this document in the Federal Register, the Commission provides all interested persons an opportunity to view and/or print the contents of this document via the internet through the Commission's Home Page (http://ferc.gov) using the "eLibrary" link. Enter the docket number excluding the last three digits in the docket number field to access the document. 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Pursuant to Section 157.9 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, within 90 days of this Notice the Commission staff will either: complete its environmental review and place it into the Commission's public record (eLibrary) for this proceeding; or issue a Notice of Schedule for Environmental Review. If a Notice of Schedule for Environmental Review is issued, it will indicate, among other milestones, the anticipated date for the Commission staff's issuance of the final environmental impact statement (FEIS) or environmental assessment (EA) for this proposal. The filing of an EA in the Commission's public record for this proceeding or the issuance of a Notice of Schedule for Environmental Review will serve to notify federal and state agencies of the timing for the completion of all necessary reviews, and the subsequent need to complete all federal authorizations within 90 days of the date of issuance of the Commission staff's FEIS or EA.

#### Statement of Property Owner's Rights

Just as the law grants certain entities the right to acquire private property, you as the owner of the property have certain rights. You have the right to:

- a. Receive just compensation for the taking of property. (Iowa Constitution, Article I, section 18)
- b. An offer to purchase, which may not be less than the lowest appraisal of the fair market value of the property. (Iowa Code section 6B.45; Iowa Code section 6B.54)
- c. Receive a copy of the appraisal, if an appraisal is required, upon which the acquiring agency's determination of just compensation is based not less than 10 days before being contacted by the acquiring agency's acquisition agent. (Iowa Code section 6B.45)
- d. An opportunity to accompany at least one appraiser of the acquiring agency who appraises your property when an appraisal is required. (Iowa Code section 6B.54)
- e. Participate in good faith negotiations with the acquiring agency before the acquiring agency begins condemnation proceedings. (Iowa Code section 6B.2B)
- f. A determination of just compensation by an impartial compensation commission and the right to appeal its award to the district court if you can- not agree on a purchase price with the acquiring agency. (Iowa Code section 6B.4; Iowa Code section 6B.7; Iowa Code section 6B.18)
- g. A review by the compensation commission of the necessity for the condemnation if your property is agricultural land being condemned for industry. (Iowa Code section 6B.4A)
- h. Payment of the agreed upon purchase price or, if condemned, a deposit of the compensation commission award before you are required to surrender possession of the property. (Iowa Code Section 6B.25; Iowa Code section 6B.26; Iowa Code section 6B.54(11))
- i. Reimbursement for expenses incidental to transferring title to the acquiring agency. (Iowa Code section 6B.33; Iowa Code section 6B.54(10))
- j. Reimbursement of certain litigation expenses: (1) if the award of the compensation commissioners exceeds 110 percent of the acquiring agency's final offer before condemnation; and (2) if the award on appeal in court is more than the compensation commissioners' award. (Iowa Code section 6B.33)
- k. At least 90 days written notice to vacate occupied property. (Iowa Code section 6B.54(4))
- Relocation services and payments, if you are eligible to receive them, and the right to appeal your eligibility for and amount of the payments. (Iowa Code section 316.9; Iowa Code section 6B.42) 4
